Kamara Bridge (Albanian: Ura e Kamares) is an Ottoman stone arch bridge over the Shkumbin river in Mirakës, part of the Librazhd municipality in Elbasan County, Albania.

The oldest standing bridge in the country is the Kauri Bridge, located in the village of Poshnjë; it dates back to the late antiquity. The longest spanning bridge is the Shushica Bridge (520 m)[citation ...
