Only the grounding bus bar is permitted to be electrically and mechanically connected to the subpanel enclosure.

If there is any damage or cracks in the electrical box, you should repair it first before grounding it. In addition, you also need to check whether the ground wire of the box has been...

As for your title question: yes, it's sufficient to ground an outlet only to its box -- if, and only if, the box itself is properly grounded. To add to Greg's answer, it's important to note when and ...

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. On the US market, a 5.26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.

A wire type equipment grounding conductor of a circuit passing through the box is not required to be connected to the box.

Solution: Ensure that the distribution box is reliably grounded, and the grounding wire should have sufficient cross-sectional area and be connected to the grounding network.
